Pastor's Message Rev. Carol Zaagsma

Conversations about race are often uncomfortable. Dr. David Anderson Hooker observes that there are three common themes that form our hesitancy to talk about race and racism: 1) the idea that there is only one race; the human race, 2) we've moved on; there is no real racism, and 3) conversations are usually so divisive that they're not worth the time or energy.

And yet it's not a very good excuse to avoid conversation around sensitive topics just because they're difficult conversations to have.

Would it surprise you to see that every annual conference, district, and local congregation within the United Methodist Church in the United States is to develop and implement a strategy and program to educate and support systemic and personal changes to end racism? If that doesn't surprise you, would it surprise you to learn that this resolution was established in 2000 (nearly twenty years ago now), with our commitment to it being renewed every four years since then? I'm afraid we have not made the progress we could have in this amount of time in our local congregation and beyond. Perhaps that is because of the prevalent notion that we don't really have a problem, or that it's just too difficult to talk about or to address.

Dr. Hooker created a video as part of a series produced by the United Methodist General Commission on Religion and Race. You may watch it here: http:// www.gcorr.org/meaningful-conversations-about-racefeaturing-rev-dr-hooker/

In the video, Dr. Hooker asserts that our systems are not neutral, but instead are shaped by biases, tradition, histories, and practices. He talks about dandelions and bluegrass to illustrate his point, as these biases are one reason that dandelions are considered weeds to be destroyed, while bluegrass is prized as creating a beautiful lawn.

Dr. Hooker suggests we consider the following list and reflect on what we consider as good/positive/appropriate/traditional appearances of:

- A dating/marriage partner
- A hardworking person
- A safe neighborhood
- Beautiful hair and skin
- A reliable world leader
- A cute baby
- The "All-American" couple
- The kind of pastor you want in your church
- Artists' renderings of Jesus, Mary or Moses

After reflecting on what you consider as good/positive/appropriate/traditional appearances of the list above, think about how your perceptions of race and racial identity influenced what you imagined as your answers. Were all the images you called to mind the same race as you? If so, it simply illustrates his point that we are shaped by our biases, tradition, histories and practices.

We've recently been reminded in the news that the first enslaved Africans arrived on our mainland 400 years ago, in August of 1619. This is a part of our history best not to ignore. It's important for us to be willing to engage in the conversation, however difficult it may be.

I'm looking at some timeframes during this program year when we may be able to study race and racism in a small group here at church, so let me know if you're interested in participating. I'd also appreciate a co-

leader to work on this together, so if God is nudging you to help lead us in this conversation, please let me know.

Mission Summit 2019


Larry Stalberger is interested in going to the Annual Mission Summit on Saturday, September 28, from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm in Motley, MN.


Farewell from Administrative Assistant

Gift Card Program

Did you know that here at church you can order gift cards to many different restaurants and retailers? It's a simple fundraising concept - you order a gift card for a certain amount. You pay that same amount to the church. During the ordering process, the church gets a rebate in the form of cash back that we apply toward our general budget.

Some companies offer an outstanding rebate. For example, Chipotle offers a 10% rebate (which means if you purchased a \$50 gift card, a \$5 rebate would go to the church). Lands' End offers a 10% rebate...so for every \$100 in gift cards purchased, a \$10 rebate goes back to the church. Caribou Coffee and CVS Pharma-

cy both offer 6% rebates, while Cub Foods offers 4%.
