

Pastor's Message Rev. Carol Zaagsma

With the end of the calendar year comes preparation for the Annual All Church Conference scheduled on Sunday, January 24, after worship. A light lunch will be provided (free-will offering appreciated). All are invited to this meeting, where 2015 year end reports, the 2016 budget, and a proposal for a new leadership structure will be presented for discussion and adoption.

I want to introduce this new leadership structure to you now, so you'll have time to look it over and think of any questions you may have before being asked to adopt it. The Lay Leadership Team (Russ Cox, Linda Lounsbury, Mary Nelson, Nancy Slagg) and I have been working on this proposal for several months, and it represents the direction many other congregations are moving toward in a single board model.

In this new structure, the Church Council will retain responsibility for overall direction of the congregation and the primary responsibilities of our administrative committees. Along with that, they will rely on subgroups and ministry teams to maintain day to day tasks related to those areas of administration and ministry.

The Board of Trustees will continue to function as they have in the past, while the Finance Committee, the Staff Parish Relations Committee, and the Lay Leadership Team (Nominations) will transition to subgroups of the Church Council. When the Church Council meets each quarter, they will take any necessary action related to financial, staffing or nomination matters.

The members of the sub-groups will be responsible for bringing their related business to the Church Council for action, so instead of separate occasional Finance or SPRC committee meetings where decisions are made, the Church Council meetings become the

place for those decisions. The sub-groups will be staffed with fewer people than their full committees were, and they will meet as needed in advance of a Church Council meeting to do their necessary work (i.e. prepare a draft of the budget or create a job description for a staff position). Many of these committees have already implemented sub-groups to do specific tasks, so this isn't that far off the mark from how our committees have actually operated.

The proposal also includes a significant change to our ministry teams. Instead of having six ministry teams (Children/Youth/Family, Faith Formation, Hospitality, Outreach, Samaritan, and Worship), the proposal calls for four ministry teams (Evangelism & Church Growth, Spiritual Growth, Mission Outreach and Congregational Care). Our ministry teams have not been fully staffed for several years now, and the four proposed teams provide attention to ministry areas that haven't had designated committees to focus on for some time.

Please take a look at the insert in this month's newsletter, where you'll see a diagram of our current structure alongside the proposed structure. A primary reason for this proposal is the difficulty we've had in fully staffing all our committees. The diagram illustrates how we will need fewer designated leaders with the new structure. We'll have a Q and A session after worship on January 17 in the Wesley Room if you'd like to hear more and discuss the proposal.
