Did You Know?

The United Methodist Cross and Flame emblem was created to mark the 1968 union of the Evangelical United Brethren Church and the Methodist Church.

The design combines the cross with a single flame composed of dual tongues of fire, signifying the church's relationship to God through Christ and the Holy Spirit.

The flame is also a reminder of Pentecost and of the transforming moment in the life of John Wesley, when he sensed God's presence and felt his heart "strangely warmed" on May 24, 1738.

The two tongues of a single flame also represent the union of the two predecessor denominations.



Mission Outreach

Love Offering

Minnesota Annual Conference is just around the corner, and one of the neatest displays of our connectional nature is always through the love offering in the way each church brings what they can and it grows to a significant contribution together.

Here at The PORT, we'll collect our love offering on May 1 and May 8. Special envelopes will be available in your bulletin both Sundays. If you'd like to send a contribution to church, just designate in the memo line of your check that it is for the "love offering."



This year, the love offering will be divided as follows:

- 40% to Minnesota Council of Churches Refugee Services. Since 1985, this program has welcomed thousands of refugees from around the world, offering support through case management, immigration, employment and education.
- 10% to United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR). This portion of the love offering will go specifically for shipping the 10,000 health kits our conference is working on putting together to parts of the world where they are most needed.
- 40% to International Child Care, Dominican Republic. Basic health care for families is a constant concern here, and health agency International Child Care has developed grassroots, community-based health and rehabilitation programs that teach parents and other residents how to care appropriately for children with disabilities.
- 10% Volunteers in Mission Scholarships. Through this program, teams spend up to two weeks working on mission projects domestically or abroad. Most teams are engaged in hands-on projects that build infrastructure to ensure that nutritional, medical, and educational programs in developing countries become sustainable and locally run. Returning team members pay their own way, but these scholarships help offset the cost for first-time participants.

The Minnesota Annual Conference Love Offering reaches near and far, supporting people in great need. This year's Annual Conference session theme is "Living Generously: Unleashing God's Gifts." Through the Love Offering, we have the opportunity to show our generosity in support of these four projects.

Native American Ministries Day

Thank you to all who participated in April's United Methodist special offering. We collected \$221 for this special offering.

This offering provides support for Native American Ministries around the country, including Minnesota's very own In-Dah-So-Gwaa-Nibb "All Feathers" Spiritual & Community Center in Cass Lake, serving members of the Leech Lake Band of Ojibwe.

Health Kits Reminder

Between now and May 31 we are collecting health kits as a part of the Minnesota Conference's goal to donate 10,000 kits for UMCOR. Details on how to assemble a health kit are available in the Narthex.
