

Pastor's Message Rev. Carol Zaagsma

I cannot remember a time ever where I so anticipated the turning over of a calendar year than I do this year. I've just had enough of 2016...celebrity deaths, including David Bowie, Dan Haggerty, Harper Lee, Patty Duke, Prince, Muhammad Ali, Morley Safer, Pat Summitt, Gene Wilder, Arnold Palmer, Leonard Cohen, John Glenn, Zsa Zsa Gabor, George Michael, Carrie Fisher and Debbie Reynolds (the last five of which were in the month of December alone), along with the vile rhetoric that was constant in a contentious political race, have made for what seems like a steady dull ache for a long time now.

I'm not usually that affected by celebrity news, but this year feels a little different – so many people I grew up watching on TV, or at the movies, or in the news due to their accomplishments, made the headlines again for one last time upon their death. They are people who, albeit it at a distance (since I didn't know any of them personally), had an effect on my life. My circle of friends would say the same. Consequently, many of us feel just a little off balance right now.

When I feel off balance, I tend to look for something that can serve as a toehold to help me regain my center. The ritual of taking down the calendar for a year that is ending, and the act of putting up a brand new one for the coming year, is one way for me to concretely feel a new start. This year I feel the need for this ritual more than most.

But the other thing that helps me is to center on Christ. Leaning on Christ, and finding strength from my faith, has helped more than a time or two when things feel out of whack. The rhythm of the church calendar can really help with this, so I am looking forward to what we are doing here at church in the coming weeks.

This Sunday, which is New Year's Day, we'll participate in a Wesleyan Covenant Renewal Service. In 1775, John Wesley introduced a covenant service as an important part of ones' spiritual life. It was a time for Methodists to gather annually in a time of self-examination, reflection, and dedication, wholly giving up themselves and renewing covenant with God. As time has gone on, this service is most often observed on the Sunday of or nearest to January 1. So, on New Year's Day, we'll gather for church and take a new look at our own faith, with the opportunity for renewal with a new start. Of course, we'll have communion, too.

After Epiphany on January 8, and focusing on the wisdom of Martin Luther King, Jr. on January 15, we'll begin a new series on "How, Then, Shall We Live?" based on a book by Wayne Muller. Here's what we'll look at during each of those weeks:

Jan. 22 – "Who Am I"

Jan. 29 – "What Do I Love?"

Feb. 5 – "How Shall I Live, Knowing I Will Die?"

Feb. 12 – "What is my Gift to the Family of the Earth?"

So church, and the rhythm of life lived here in community, does help keep me grounded when so many other things are out of control. It also helps me maintain hope in what lies ahead.

In Lamentations 3:22-23, we are assured that, "the steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end, they are new every morning." Ecclesiastes 11:7 reminds us that, "light is sweet; how pleasant to see a new day dawning." And in Revelation 21:5, God offers a promise when saying, "See, I am making all things new." With every new year...actually with every new day, and even with every new minute, this promise is before us. So if you also are looking forward to renewal ahead, begin the new year here at church, where your faith will be

strengthened as you are reminded of the new life we have in Christ.

Mission Outreach

Operation Christmas Child

Despite less than ideal road conditions, twelve of us arrived in Eagan to process shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child on December 17. Thanks to all of our members who filled shoeboxes, Pastor Carol dropped off 49 filled shoeboxes from The PORT!

Eight processing stations were open when we arrived. Teams were assigned to the various stations and worked to make sure each box was labeled with the gender and age and that it didn't contain any inappropriate items (unsafe items, liquids, war-related items). Then the shoebox was taped shut so that no items would fall out, and then placed in a carton with 16-20 other shoeboxes for shipping around the world.

Music was playing. We were reminded to pray for each

child who would receive the gift box; the only gift they might receive all year. There were all sizes of boxes, from infant shoe size to boot size. Some were so full we could barely close the cover! Others were sparse. There were "filler items" to add but the items were not universal for all ages, so we had to use some discretion when adding items.

We were part of the last teams to process this year. When there were about 165 boxes left to process, the countdown started. It was exciting to be part of a project that brings news of Jesus to children who might not otherwise hear the good news and receive a personal gift. There was cheering as each team completed processing by finishing up their remaining boxes. I expect we will do this again next year. If you haven't done this before, join us next year.
