The Congregational Care Team established The PORT Pacer walking program last fall. Three different walking routes were mapped out and measured: a loop around the fellowship hall is 0.03 miles; a loop around the first floor only (no stairs!) is 0.1 miles; and a loop that includes stairs in the education wing is 0.11 miles. This program is perfect to invite a friend or neighbor to, as it is open to everyone.

We encourage you to come at 11:00 am on Tuesdays and Thursdays for a little exercise walking around the building. It would be wonderful if additional fellowship grew out of this—perhaps going to lunch with friends you just walked with, or walk a few loops and then play a game of cards. The building is open and you are welcome to come and use it. If you can't come on Tuesdays and Thursdays, you are welcome to come walk anytime during office hours (Tue, Wed, Thur from 9 am - 3 pm) or before a meeting or choir practice, or even after worship on Sunday.

Feed My Starving Children

We have 50 spots reserved to help pack meals at a mobile packing site (15125 Cedar Ave, Apple Valley - the former Rainbow Foods) on Saturday, February 11, from 2:30-4:30 pm. Children as young as 5 years old can help when accompanied by an adult, so enlist the help of every generation! See Steve Soucy to reserve your spot.

Collection Programs at The PORT

We are all accustomed to recycling items in our homes. Here at church, we have opportunity to participate in some common programs for the good of our community and beyond. Collection bins can be found in the sanctuary narthex on a table near the memorial garden patio door.



"Labels for Education" are found on the UPC codes of Campbell's soups and Swanson's chicken broth labels. These are sent to the United

Methodist Red Bird Mission in Kentucky, which is in one of the most poverty-stricken communities in the United States, and redeemed by them for their school. This program is being discontinued nation-wide, so we will send our last collection this summer.

We also have a collection container for General Mills "Box Tops for Education" from cereals and other packaged food and TOPS paper items. These box tops are given to Valley View Elementary School so they can



redeem them for cash (earning up to \$20,000 per year).

And you can also collect cancelled postage stamps for "Tubfrim," which is based in Nesbyen, Norway. The organization was founded by their postmaster in 1928, with the goal being to collect stamps and sell them to

collectors, with the proceeds being used to wipe out tuberculosis amongst Norwegian children. The program has expanded to help handicapped children and youth. So just tear or cut off the cancelled postage stamps from the mail you receive, and bring them here to church.

Aluminum pop can tabs can also be dropped off here at church, and will be picked up by Emma M. for school. Have you accumulated extra empty pill bottles with lids? There is a separate collection box for these. Mark Wicks will give them to a friend for distribution by medical clinics in developing countries. Please remove any labels before dropping off your pill bottles, so that your personal information remains private.

Lastly, we have a recycling agreement for inkjet cartridges and small electronics (cell phones, tablets, iPads, laptops, mp3 players, handheld electronic games, GPS

devices, video cameras, and digital cameras - even broken ones!). Take these old, unwanted items that are cluttering your home office and turn them into income for our church. The collection box is typically on the floor underneath the table holding the other collection items.



We are no longer collecting milk bottle caps or eveglasses. Kemps ended their "Nickels for Schools" program in 2012, and prescription eyeglasses can be recycled at nearly every optometrist office when you pick up your new prescription (look for display boxes placed there by the Lions Club).

Please note: it is very helpful for you to sort your donations into the appropriate containers. That has to be done before they can be sent to where they will ultimately go, so if you do that as you drop them off, it helps keep the collection bin organized and ensures your donations will be processed and sent to the proper place.
