Begin the Lenten season with this special worship service, which calls us to repentance.



☐ Alone Time Schedule yourself some peace. Be reflective. Think grateful thoughts.	☐ Binge Watch/Listen Go ahead and catch up on what you missed, or enjoy it all again.	☐ Blanket Fort Make a place to hide. Invite somebody inside. 

Feed My Starving Children

We had a unique opportunity to help pack meals at a mobile Feed My Starving Children packing site in Apple Valley on February 11. Forty volunteers from The PORT joined in with over 900 other volunteers to work from 11:30-1:30. With so many people around the Twin Cities pitching in, we were able to pack 1,215 boxes during our shift. That equals 262,440 meals, which will feed 719 kids for a year. When people say, "Blessed to be a blessing," this is the kind of thing they're referring to. It was truly a blessing to be a part of this great venture.




