

But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus..." (Matthew 28:5)

Have you ever looked for Jesus...really looked for Jesus?

Perhaps it's an easy question for the early believers, as they could look for (and find) Jesus on the mountain, on the plain, in the wilderness, in the garden, outside the gate, in the cities, in the villages, in the boat, by the sea, on the sea, in the house, in the synagogues. People who looked for Jesus could find him in any number of different places.

In fact, the stories we've been reading on Sunday mornings during Lent are about people who went searching for Jesus: Satan found him in the wilderness, Nicodemus found him in the middle of the night, the woman found him at the well, the man born blind was found by Jesus as he "walked along," and Mary, Martha and Lazarus called for Jesus to come to Bethany.

Do you suppose the same could be true today – that we could look for and find Jesus? Where do you look for him?

At daybreak on that first Easter morning, Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James and Joseph went to see the tomb...they went, as the angel said, "looking for Jesus."

They knew where Jesus was buried, and they expected his body to be inside the secure tomb that had been sealed with a stone. The last thing they expected was for an angel to be there, sitting on the rolled-back stone, with Jesus' body gone! After all, how and why wouldn't they find what they were looking for? But the angel tells them that Jesus is going on ahead to Galilee; where they will see him there.

Now, we know the rest of the story, as it is told in the Bible, that is. Mark and Luke report the ascension of Jesus into heaven. And we are assured in Matthew of Jesus' promise that "I am with you always, to the end of the age."

So what does it mean to look for Jesus after the resurrection story? Where are you looking for Jesus today? I hope you are looking for (well, not only that...for I also hope you are seeing) the Risen Christ in the places you go and in the people you meet.

I hope you see the Risen Christ here at The PORT, where you come for worship and fellowship. I hope you see the Risen Christ when working together with others in mission at VEAP, Feed My Starving Children, and elsewhere. I hope you see the Risen Christ in those you serve. And I hope you see the Risen Christ in yourself.

Here is an excerpt from Saint Teresa of Avila's poem, *Christ Has No Body*:

Christ has no body but yours – No hands, no feet on earth but yours Yours are the eyes with which he looks – Compassion on this world

As Easter approaches and you go looking for the One who is "with us always, to the end of the age," look with such eyes of compassion...and I'm pretty sure you'll see the Risen Christ in those you meet, and they'll see the Risen Christ right back in you. Praise be to God!


