Pastor's Message Rev. Carol Zaagsma

I came across an article the other day that posed the question, "Why do pastors write so poorly for their own church newsletters?" The article was written by Lillian Daniel, a clergyperson I have admired since hearing her preach at the Festival of Homiletics a few years ago. Homiletics is a fancy word for "the art of preaching," and only the best of the best preachers are invited to preach at a Festival like this. So I read further with interest.

"I don't aspire to write like Paul in every newsletter," she confessed, "but I am humbled that 2,000 years later, we know him by his letters." I know that when mentoring a number of seminary students who are in the process toward becoming a pastor, I have personally had conversations with them about how important it is to use the pastor's page wisely with articles that inform about congregational matters, inspire toward something upcoming, or otherwise help the readers further along their path of spiritual formation.

However, "the front page, saved for the pastor," Lillian Daniel continued, "is often wasted on a throw away paragraph, a canned story from the Internet, or a few sentences from a reference book." She was perplexed by how often the pastor's article begins with a statistic ("Did you know 90% of Americans say they believe in God...") but then go nowhere...a phenomenon she has seen illustrated by some very fine and articulate preachers, time and time again.

Of course, she offered some convincing arguments about why this happens: pastors get busy; and they often pour their creativity into the weekly sermon. She ultimately suggests, "Sometimes another 250 words for the newsletter is more than we can scrape from an empty jar." I can certainly relate.

Since the intended audience for her article was pastors, she tried to impress upon her readers that "churches and clergy will be remembered historically not through their sermons, but through those dreaded pastor's pages. Fifty years from now, our sermons may or may not exist, but in churches large and small, a volunteer archivist will have piles of newsletters organized by date over the decades. Newer, web-based newsletters are going to have an even longer shelf life than the paper ones." Irregardless of how long church newsletters are to be kept (which is permanently...as in forever...according to conference archival standards), I have always aspired to write something worth your time to read. It's a matter of my respect for you. It's also a matter of my care about your engagement within your church, and my care for your own spiritual growth. So, as a matter of principle, I spend a good amount of time ensuring all the content in your newsletter, including the pastor's page I write, contains something of substance that aims toward better engagement in the life of your church, celebrates what is happening here, or urges you to a deeper level of spiritual growth.

But there has been more than one occasion when I have wondered if such an effort is worth it. Like almost every pastor I've ever talked to, I wonder how much the church newsletter, including my pastor's message, actually gets read. I've even dreamed of planting a little statement in the middle of some article saying, "Are you still reading? If so, reply to receive a \$5 gift card."

So, I am actively inviting you to share with me about your level of engagement with my pastor's pages and the newsletter as a whole. I don't have a fancy internet survey set up, nor do I have listening post sessions scheduled. I just want to hear from you in a face to face conversation, in an email, or a handwritten and signed note about what you like or dislike about the newsletter, including the pastor's page, and why you do or don't read it.

I will listen to your feedback with interest and compassion, and will do my best to do so without a defensive spirit or posture (remember, I've poured a lot of energy into this publication every month, so it is a little personal). I will also make note of your feedback, so that I might evaluate all I hear to work with some of our leaders to either continue what we're doing if it is meaningful, or to make changes if it's not. So please, consider

my request, and help me use my time for you in the most effective manner possible, by letting me know about your monthly Portlight's usefulness for you.

In each of the combined worship services with Portland Avenue, Hillcrest and Church of Peace UMCs during Lent, we received an offering for the VEAP food shelf. Here are the results of each service:

Ash Wednesday at Church of Peace: \$330.50 Maundy Thursday at Portland Avenue: \$208.00 Good Friday 1 PM at Church of Peace: \$180.00 Good Friday 7 PM at Hillcrest: \$227.53

Added all together, we sent a total of \$946.03 to VEAP (Volunteers Enlisted to Assist People) for distribution to people in need in Bloomington, Richfield and Edina.

2016 Bazaar Results

The 2016 Bazaar earned a bit more than \$11,000! Thanks to all who made it happen! 10% will go to Outreach, as is our custom. In addition, a total of \$4,740 will go to specific requests from the Ministry groups:

- Trustees requested \$1,800 for roof repair on the Fellowship Hall. Another \$600 is needed to re-caulk the Sanctuary skylight to eliminate leakage.
- A new safe was purchased for \$600 by the Trustees to securely store important church documents.
- The Worship Committee requested \$700 to repair our organ, an important part of worship services.
- Evangelism & Church Growth asked for \$190 to

replace pens in the pews.

- We plan to once again offer a Training Camp for school kids, reconfigured and called Kick Start to School. This is a similar program we did a few years ago to help prepare kids for the upcoming school year. Pastor requested \$250 as seed money for this program.
- As you know, we regularly participate in Feed My Starving Children. While we willingly do the manual labor of packaging the meals, there is a need to pay for the materials that go into the meals. We will dedicate \$600 for those costs over the year.

So the total of \$4,740 will be provided from the 2016 Bazaar fund for these worthy needs. ~Russ Cox
