

Pastor's Message Rev. Carol Zaagsma

The well-known theme song for the Lion King sums up a recent week in my life:

It's the Circle of Life
And it moves us all
Through despair and hope
Through faith and love
Till we find our place
On the path unwinding
In the Circle
The Circle of Life.

In the span of a week and a half, our congregation was involved in three funerals for loved ones. One of those funerals was for a woman I never met: Beverly Griffith, the wife of Portland Avenue United Methodist Church's first full-time pastor. They were appointed here from 1955-1958. Every funeral reinforces that death is a natural part of life, yet with the recognition that Beverly was part of the life of this church in such a critical moment, her death feels just a little different – as part of the Circle of Life, yet with a certain chapter of it coming to a more complete ending.

While preparing for these funerals, I was also packing for a quick trip to Missouri. My oldest nephew graduated from high school on May 11. Graduation is one of those days 18 years in the making, yet it comes so



quickly. Attending his graduation, which was from the same high school I graduated from, brought forth those teenage memories in me as well. Rites of passage such as high school graduation are part of the Circle of Life.

As I returned back to the office, Camille came to my office door and asked if I wanted to see something kind of cute...and then took me to the memorial garden window to point out momma duck and 11 babies!

We were prepared for a brood to seek a safe harbor

here at The PORT.

Momma ducks have
been nesting at our place

Ruby Madsen wrote a
children's book about it!
The Circle of Life comes
around again.



Since the duck family was discovered on Tuesday morning, I knew there would be some helpful hands coming that evening for Bazaar Workshop, so I recruited a few crafters to meet a little early that evening to carry forth our rescue plan.



Thankfully, we arrived to find momma duck and ducklings huddled in a corner of the path, over by the patio door entrance from the north narthex.

We took the large kennel that had been placed in the garden for shelter, and slowly closed in on the momma duck and her

ducklings. Working together, we coaxed her into the kennel and shut the door (much more difficult to do than it is to describe here).

Her babies did not follow her into the kennel. So we scooped them into a cardboard box...well, 10 of them. The 11th began running around the garden, so that was another site to see. That little one on the run was finally captured, too.

We loaded everyone up in my vehicle, and drove over to Smith Park, carried the kennel and box closer to the water, and let 'em go.

They waddled down to the water and swam away - a natural continuation in the Circle of Life.

As the song says, the Circle of Life moves us all...we go through despair, but we also find hope and faith and love. The Circle of Life is not just a cute Disney story – it's also the framework of our faith...and Christ is ever inviting us to live it together with him and one another.


