If it rains we'll move to Fellowship Hall.



Pastor's Message Rev. Carol Zaagsma



Blake Mahre and I attended Minnesota Annual Conference in St. Cloud from June 19-22. This is an annual gathering of laity and clergy around the state. We gather to celebrate accomplishments, worship, learn, and otherwise engage in business relative to our conference.

This year's theme was "Encounter the Spirit: Live Expectantly!" and our keynote speaker was Rev. Dr. Junius Dotson, the General Secretary (like a CEO) of Discipleship Ministries. Rev. Dotson challenged us to clearly articulate our "why" as a congregation, teaching us that when we know our "why," then our "what" becomes more impactful.

And then he reminded us that our "why" is pretty clear: it is growing in relationship with Jesus Christ. Here at The PORT, we may say it in terms of our mission: "To grow followers of Jesus who change the world."

Dr. Dotson observed that many churches have lost passion for making disciples while building bridges to nowhere. We mistake activities for accomplishment. And as I heard him say this, I recognized that these challenging words are worthy of reflection within every church community I have ever been a part of.

This is not a unique message. I heard it again and again when I retraced the steps of John and Charles Wesley through England several years ago, as we were reminded that the church does not exist for itself or its members; it exists to serve with Christ in the world that God loves.

A church that has forgotten why they exist may be filled with people who are motivated mostly to care for one another...members may think the church has no business offering a voice in politics in ways that guide public policy toward social justice; prayer requests are often only for close family members; invitations to programs or events are rarely extended beyond members and constituents; and church members look only to receive benefits from membership rather than searching for ways to serve others.

The church does not exist for itself or its members; it exists to serve with Christ in the world that God loves.

Oh, but how often we need to be reminded of this. A church that exists to "serve with Christ in the world that God loves" remembers its call in the Great Commandment to *love God, neighbor, and self...* (Matthew 22:36-40) and in the Great Commission to *go therefore and make disciples of all nations...* (Matthew 28:19-20).

I'm convinced that at the root of it all is the love of Christ that we cultivate in our hearts. For a church filled with the love of Christ can't help but to share that with the world. After all, Christ was all about sharing the good news beyond conventional boundaries...to the outsiders...beyond the walls of the city gates... inviting all others into this unconditional love and life of discipleship.

So, as the summer progresses, remember why we exist here at this church...to serve with Christ in the world that God loves. Cultivate that sort of love in your heart...and warmly welcome others to journey with you here into such a life of faith.

Special Offering for Peace With Justice

We will observe Peace With Justice Sunday on July 16.

News from VEAP

The Summer Youth Food Program is moving into high gear to accommodate the needs of families in the community. VEAP is seeing about a 10% increase in the number of households seeking food support during the months that children are not in school.

We continue several ways to support VEAP here. One is to bring non-perishable food items and place them in the bin by the Fellowship Hall entrance. Another is

to recognize a special milestone (birthday, anniversary, etc.) with a VEAP food basket on Sunday morning. To do this, sign up on the poster chart on the bulletin board outside the sanctuary. Then write a check to PAUMC for \$15, include "VEAP food basket" in the memo, and place in the offering plate on a Sunday morning or mail to church.


