Pastor's Message Rev. Carol Zaagsma

You will always know what is important to me or The PORT, or just what is on my mind by reading this page of the newsletter. This month, I am going to share news and an invitation about something that is also very important to our United Methodist world-wide denomination in these times.

The 2016 General Conference called upon the Council of Bishops to guide The United Methodist Church in finding a "way forward" through the four-decade-long divide we have had on the matter of homosexuality. As a result, the Council formed a Commission on a Way Forward to assist the bishops with this task. The Commission will make its final report to the Council of Bishops in May, 2018, and the Council, in turn, will make its recommendation to a called session of the General Conference in February, 2019. I am part of the Minnesota delegation that will be attending and voting at this gathering.

This Fall (September – November), Bishop Bruce Ough will be hosting 15 regional conversations across the Dakotas-Minnesota Area regarding the Commission's work. He is eager to (1) keep you informed about their deliberations and progress and, more significantly (2) gather your thoughts about a way forward. He is interested, among other things, to dialogue about how you see The United Methodist Church remaining united in the presence of significant cultural, regional and theological differences.

I encouraged you to pre-register for the regional gathering you would like to attend. Your pre-registration will assist the host congregations to prepare appropriate meeting space and hospitality. You can register for any regional gathering that is convenient for you. Each gathering will last approximately 2 hours.

A complete listing of all meeting dates, times and locations can be found below and on the registration site. I put in bold type the meetings closest to Bloomington, while leaving the whole list here for you to see the scope intended and reach planned for these meetings.

The PORT will be sending a group of 38 to pack meals on Saturday, October 14, 2017, from 9-11 am. Steve Soucy will be signing up volunteers starting October 1.

UMCOR Disaster Relief

Thanks to many generous donors here at The PORT, we sent \$2,925 to UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) in September for domestic disaster recovery in the United States and its territories (which includes Puerto Rico). Every penny donated to designated projects such as this go directly to the areas affected; none goes for administrative support (donations for administrative support are received through the special UMCOR Sunday offering in the Spring). Of course, those projects most immediately addressed are areas affected by Hurricanes Harvey and Irma.

There is still time to donate to UMCOR's relief efforts. The goal for domestic disaster relief has now been met, so we're going to designate all of our UMCOR donations received in October for international disaster relief, which will aid areas such as Sierra Leone as they

recover from massive mudslides; East Africa as they experience prolonged drought; the Caribbean Islands as they recover from Hurricane Irma; and Oaxaca and Chiapas, Mexico, as they recover from a powerful earthquake in September that damaged homes, hospitals and infrastructure. There is much greater ground to cover in international disaster recovery, so let's continue to support UMCOR with our donations this month to help beyond our borders.

Holiday Giving Program

It is already that time of year when Walker Methodist Health Center is starting to plan their annual Give a Little Gift Program. Every resident will receive a 9x8x5 Christmas bag containing uniform donations of candy, socks, pocket size Kleenex, and a \$3.00 coupon from the Walker Auxiliary for Marge's Gift Shop. To that, Walker staff will add other donations appropriate to the needs of the individual resident.

Help us collect new, unwrapped items to fill these bags. October 8, 15, and 22 a box in the narthex area will accept your donations. Suggested items include: chocolates, ChapStick, DVD or CDs, sugar free candy, cookies and crackers, gloves and scarves, socks, pocket Kleenex, small stuffed animals, slippers, jewelry.

Office Window Air Conditioner

One morning Pastor Carol discovered that a critter of some sort had been busy the night before, pulling apart the foam insulation between the window air conditioning unit and the wall of the church office.



Thank you to Tom Wellman for answering the call immediately to come and resolve this problem. He removed the foam on the left side, and the pot holders on the right that had been used to plug the gap between the wall and the air conditioner, and installed a wood panel on the inside and metal strips on the outside to seal it. Hopefully this will deter any unwanted pests from entering the building as temperatures get colder outside.



Spire Painting

On the hottest day of the Fall, Don Anderson and Floyd Ekstrom climbed up on the roof of the sanctuary to prep the spire for painting. They scraped the peeling paint off and primed it with a rustinhibiting primer, and let that cure for a couple of weeks.



Then they returned on a much more comfortable Fall day,

cleaned the spire to finish the preparation, and painted it anew. Take a look up toward the sky the next time you come to church. You'll surely notice the difference!



Coat Rack Overhaul

Paul Richardson is working on constructing a Welcome Desk, using wood from broken pews so it fits into the décor of our narthex. Part of the project involved dismantling the storage closet outside the sacristy in order to utilize some of those wood panels, too. After removing the closet, the free-standing coat racks were moved further north to create a more open coat storage area.

As the countdown continues to this year's Bazaar, following are ways everyone here at The PORT can jump in to be a part of this great event:

- •Pray gratitude for those who are already baking, creating, canning, sewing, and constructing products to be sold; pray encouragement for the Bazaar Committee leaders; and pray that God's Spirit will be felt by all who will volunteer and come to The PORT for the Bazaar.
- •Participate in our "world famous" Bake Sale. Over the years we have acquired quite a following of folks who come just to buy our pies, cookies and canned goods. Consider baking and sharing one of your family's favorites with us. Or are you a canner? People love jams, jellies, salsas and sauces, and dare we say pickles? They make great gifts as well as additions to holiday gatherings. Please drop off canned bake sale donations on Thursday or Friday, Nov. 9 – 10.
- •Donate products to sell at the Bazaar. We only sell newly-handmade holiday décor and gifts, needlework and wood products. These items are always popular, but please remember that they must be handmade. We do not sell pre-made or purchased retail products at the Bazaar. Include cost of the materials and a suggested selling price, as well as the quantity to be donated.
- 'Assemble a Silent Auction Basket. This is where you could donate a collector's item in mint condition, a service from your business, a gift card from a favorite restaurant or retailer, or a gift basket filled with newly-purchased items that relate to a theme (like all things chocolate, spa, hobby, theme party, or all about a particular sport.
