Have you ever wanted to read the Bible in its entirety? While there are certainly some difficult passages and sections of the Bible that seem rather monotonous, it is a significant accomplishment to read the Bible all the way through, and I think everyone should do this at least once in their lifetime.



I'll confess that while I might encourage you to begin such a challenge as each new year approaches, I do not always complete the task myself every year. But in the years that I did finish a Bible-reading plan, I ended the year with a renewed love for the stories found there, and I might even describe the feeling as if I had regained an old friend.

I think 2018 is the year for me to once again read the entire Bible. Maybe you're feeling like trying the challenge as well. I've printed three different Bible-reading plans, all available for you in the narthex. One of the plans has you reading a little bit from the Old and New Testaments each day (this is the one I plan to try). Another divides the readings by genre (this has been my favorite plan in the past). The last will have you read through the New Testament within the year, giving you a couple days each week for reflection. One of the best ways to stick with any Bible-reading plan is to offer encouragement to one another. So if you decide to give this a try, be sure to tell me, and I'll ask you from time to time how it's going. I invite you also to check in with me to see how it's going.

If you're not going to be at church December 31 but want to begin reading on January 1, let me know what plan you'd like to try and I will mail or email a copy of it to you. Our mission is to grow followers of Jesus who change the world, and one way to grow as a follower of Jesus is to engage in disciplined study, so I do hope you'll consider joining me in reading through the Bible this year.

Faith in the Family

New Year's Eve Tradition

On occasion, I will offer a summary of a faith practice you may wish to try at home with your family. This suggestion, designed for school ages and older, comes from Traci Smith as found in her book *Seamless Faith: Simple Practices for Daily Family Life.*

- 1) In January, place a large box or basket in a prominent location in the house. Label with the year on it.
- 2) Throughout the year, put significant items in the basket, such as ticket stubs, programs, church bulletins from important holidays, photo of a special day, etc. You may also use scraps of paper to write down or draw pictures of important memories as they happen during the year.

- 3) On New Year's Eve, take turns pulling items out of the basket and reflect upon where God was present in that particular day.
- 4) Concluded your New Year's Eve remembrance by holding hands and saying, "Thank you, God, for the many ways you were with us last year, in good times and in difficult ones. We are thankful for the many blessings of this year. Amen."

Note: It might be tempting to put only happy memories in the box, but consider also adding memories of more challenging times as well (evidence of hospital stays, bulletins from the death of a loved one, etc.). God is with us in good and difficult times, and it is valuable to remember both the good and the challenging times.

Human Relations Day - January 14

The Social Principles of The United Methodist Church invite us to step out of our comfort zones and take care of the world we live in, just as Jesus cared for it.

The Human Relations Day special offering strengthens community outreach through programs like one in Central Russia that provides interactive training experiences for at-risk youth so that they can respond to social challenges such as drug trafficking and abuse, alcoholism, domestic violence and human trafficking.

A special offering envelope will be provided in your bulletin Sunday, January 14.

Campbell's Soup Label Program Ends

The Label's For Education program supported by Campbell's Soup, Swanson, Pepperidge Farm and other food companies has now ended. We have been collecting these labels for some time, and recently mailed off our last package to Red Bird United Methodist Mission in Kentucky for them to redeem the points that have accrued.



Our Labels For Education donation included 54 labels worth 5 points each, as well as 216 labels worth 1 point each, for a total of 486 points!

We continue to participate in other collection programs, including Box Tops (which we give to Valley View Elementary School), pop can tabs (which benefit Ronald McDonald House), cancelled postage stamps which helps "Tubfrim" based in Nesbyen, Norway, and empty pill bottles to be sent to medical clinics in developing countries.

We also have a recycling agreement for inkjet cartridges and small electronics (cell phones, tablets, laptops, mp3 players, digital cameras and GPS devices), which is a fundraiser for The PORT.

Please drop off donations in the designated containers near the welcome table in the north narthex (by the Sanctuary). Together we can make a big difference in the world both near and far.


