## Pastor's Message Rev. Carol Zaagsma

It is with great joy and anticipation that I am writing you to ask for your support for our Kick Start to School summer school program for elementary school children. This year's dates are from July 16-August 2. Because of the long summer vacation, children lose ground academically over the summer. This is called "summer slide," which is especially prevalent in low-income families where structured programs are less available. As a result of our first two summer school programs, not only did the children not "slide," but actually made excellent strides in reading during the program.

One of the benefits of our program is the use of The Writing Road to Reading Program, which teaches phonics explicitly. The program uses in depth and clear training on the use of all the 2, 3, and 4 letter combinations which make up the English language, such as "ough," "igh," "ci" and 41 other such letter combinations. "Ough" makes six different sounds, such as in the words though, through, rough, cough, thought, and bough.

Another advantage to our program is the small ratio of teachers to students. The students will have an opportunity to learn in a small group setting as well as in a larger group.

We have a lot of fun at Kick Start to School. Our Administrator, Cindy Deal, is also a substitute teacher for Bloomington Public Schools. Whenever she runs into former students from the program, they always tell her how much fun they had and ask if we are going to have the program again.

We aim to raise \$2,500 for a summer school program of approximately 20 students, which works out to be only \$125 per student for a three week program. While this amount is quite low for a program of this nature, we are reaching out to underserved children in this area for whom the entire cost would be unaffordable. The fee will be \$20 per child, or \$30 per family, with scholarships available if this small fee is a hardship. The majority of our budget will go to teacher salaries, as we want skilled staff working with children, while also providing supplies and healthy snacks so the students will be prepared to learn.

Now that the season of Lent is behind us, we can see how quickly each individual offering adds up. Here are our totals for 2018:

#### 2018 Love Offering

We will receive this year's love offering on Sunday, May 13. Special envelopes will be provided in the bulletins that morning.

All United Methodist churches in Minnesota are invited to participate in the love offering, which will be brought by Pastor Carol and Megan Mahre when they attend the Minnesota Annual Conference in St. Cloud from May 30-June 1.

This year's Love Offering for Missions will support three projects:

- Puerto Rico Hurricane Recovery Trips (65%). Volunteer in Mission trips will commence in the fall. Most of the funds will be used for construction supplies bought and used on the island. Some of the funds will cover the purchase of hygiene kits and cleaning bucket supplies.
- Park Avenue UMC Children's Defense Fund Freedom Schools Program (20%). This is a six-week summer day camp experience for children. It's mission is to ensure that every child receives "a healthy start, a head start, a fair start, a safe start, and a moral start in life and successful passage to adulthood with the help of caring families and communities.
- NUMAS Haus (15%). This is an emergency shelter for single women and their children in New Ulm and surrounding Brown County.

When everyone chips in a little bit, we can do great things as a Minnesota Annual Conference, with total contributions from all our congregations often reaching close to \$100,000.


We've invited all the other churches that use our building to help, so let's have a good showing from The PORT in an effort to work well together for the benefit of all.

#### Kite Day Family Festival!


Come to Valley View Playfield (9000 Portland Avenue, Bloomington) on May 19 from 11:00 am-2:00 pm and fly kites with your family!


There will be free kites for those 18 and younger, while supplies last.
