Pastor's Message Rev. Carol Zaagsma

This month I'd like to share with you some news that will have a future impact on traffic in our part of Bloomington. Last month I attended a listening session between local businesses and the Minnesota Department of Transportation and its partners (Hennepin County, Metro Transit, and the cities of Edina, Richfield and Bloomington).

The purpose of the meeting was for local businesses to learn about long-term fixes being planned on Interstate 494 between Hwy 169 and the Airport; to hear about how changes to the I-494 access at Nicollet Ave, Portland Ave, and 12th Ave may affect our area; and to share our comments.

The project is planned to start as early as 2022. It's important to note that the final design is not determined yet, and that was part of the reason for this meeting. Even so, due to initial feasibility studies, the focus is currently on the possibility of closing access to I-494 at both Nicollet and 12th Avenues, while building up access at Portland Avenue in order to accommodate the increased traffic. This might fall into the "what they didn't teach me in seminary" file; but even so, I found it quite interesting to see the various types of interchange designs available to choose from, including a tight diamond interchange, diverging diamond interchange, Texas U-Turn, roundabout, and single point urban interchange. It was with care that neighboring business owners and I looked over the designs, wrote feedback and questions on the diagrams, and voted for the design we thought would be best.

While none of the interchange designs would result in construction on our property, we will most certainly see changing traffic patterns according to the final design selected (as in a lot more traffic driving by)...especially if Portland Avenue becomes the only entrance/exit possibilities between Lyndale and Cedar Avenues.

Another significant impact could be to the access to existing businesses just to our North. Another meeting is planned this month to "explore ideas to reimagine the 'gateway' between Bloomington and Richfield." This is possible through a grant from a program called the Congress for New Urbanism Legacy Projects. You may learn more about this at https://www.bloomingtonmn.gov/plan/portland-legacy

While this is pretty much what I know at the moment, you can depend on me to give updates when available. You are also invited to the following public events:

- Monday, March 23 from 6-8 pm at Richfield City Hall (6700 Portland Ave S) to focus on identifying opportunities and challenges and generating ideas.
- Thursday, March 26 from 6-8 pm here at Portland Avenue UMC (8000 Portland Ave S) where the design team will present and seek input on various ideas and actions to revitalize the area.

I suppose this can all be a bit disconcerting. Yet it also could be pretty interesting to see how all of this might bring greater visibility to our ministries here at The PORT. It could be that God is on the brink of doing yet a new thing with us! I pray we will be faithful and wise stewards of our witness, vision, mission, values, and heritage as all this unfolds around us.

Ash Wednesday Offering for VEAP


