

### Pastor's Message Rev. Carol Zaagsma

#### Dear Friends,

If you're not accustomed to getting a physical copy of the Portlight Newsletter mailed to you every month, you might be wondering why you are receiving one now.



We've done a recent audit on our email system. You may not know that we manage two email systems. First is the office records where we maintain physical and email addresses, telephone number, and membership records such as worship attendance and committee roles. Second is a separate email system designed for mass emailing. This system is required due to some communication laws designed to protect consumers against unwanted spam emails. This system is a subscription-based system which allows you to opt out of all future emails whenever you want.

The problem is that our two systems do not talk to one another. So when you update your email address, both systems must be updated in order for you to continue to receive all communications from The PORT.

I mentioned that the second system is a subscriptionbased system. What that means is that we cannot simply add new email addresses to it...we can only send you an invitation - and then YOU must accept the invitation in order to receive the newsletter.

Needless to say, over time there is a significant discrepancy between the two systems. For example, we have 136 email addresses of our members and active friends in our primary database; and yet only 105 people have subscribed to our monthly newsletter sent through the second system (the mass email system). To make the discrepancy even greater, of the 105 email addresses in the mass email database, 24 are of former members or long-ago visitors. That means over 50 of our current members and active friends ARE NOT getting the monthly newsletter.

We aim to rectify that...and need your help to do so!

We would love to close the gap by getting more of our current members and friends subscribed to our mass email system. To accomplish this, Kathryn in the church office will be emailing invitations through our mass email system to those of you who are not currently on that mass email distribution list. The email will come from "News from The PORT List Owner" and it will say "You've been invited to Subscribe to 'News From The PORT'." There will be a green box to click on that says "Subscribe to, News From The PORT." Clicking on that will take you to one other screen where you can type in your first and last name, then click on the green "Subscribe" box. After doing this, you will get future Portlight Newsletters by email, along with a few other time-sensitive reminders.

We promise we will not flood your in-box through this mass email system. You will receive the monthly newsletter along with any other urgent emails (like if worship is canceled due to weather...a rather rare occurrence). During the pandemic, while in-person worship is suspended, you will also begin to receive your weekly "Worship While Away" email through this mass email system instead of through Pastor Carol's email address.

Ministry has always placed a value on relationships. While we are physically distanced and not seeing one another as frequently as we would like, written communication through email and the postal service is absolutely critical in helping you remain aware of what's going on at The PORT. And I have always tried very hard to help raise your awareness as to what is going on with your church. It was actually quite sad for me to learn that so many in our congregation have not been receiving the communications we work so hard to share.

But now we have a plan to improve on this. So, please watch for an email from "News from The PORT List Owner" and then follow the instructions to subscribe. If you're already getting the Portlight by email, you won't get another invitation - that's because you're already set up.

Thank you for your help with this so that we can start off the new year (yes...the new year is *al*-

*most here!!!*) with as many people as possible getting timely news from The PORT.

#### Conference-wide News Related to COVID-19 by Bishop Bruce R. Ough



**Re-Gathering Plan for Churches** *On Thursday, Nov. 19, Bishop Bruce R. Ough turned the dial on the Minnesota Conference's <u>Phased Re-Gathering Plan for Churches</u> from orange to red. Below is a letter to Minnesota United Methodists explaining the reason for the change:* 

Dear Minnesota United Methodists,

I am alarmed and frightened. The coronavirus pandemic is out of control in Minnesota and most of the country. Our hospitals are overwhelmed. Our front-line health care workers are exhausted. The Minnesota Department of Health told faith leaders in their most re-

cent call that when you gather with others outside your home, you are not just at risk for exposure, you can *expect* to be exposed to COVID-19. That is how rampant the community spread currently is across our state.

As you might know, Minnesota Gov. Tim Walz on Wednesday <u>announced a four-week shutdown</u> of bars, restaurants, entertainment venues, and fitness clubs, starting Friday, Nov. 20. Weddings and funerals are permitted, but wedding receptions and post-funeral gatherings of any size are not.

Although in-person worship is still permitted, it is strongly discouraged by health officials and thus we are turning the dial on our <u>Phased Re-Gathering Plan</u> back to red for the foreseeable future. I ask that all churches return to virtual worship if you have not already done so, that all clergy and staff work from home, and that in-person activities in our buildings be limited to pre-schools, daycares, and emergency relief activities.

I urge you in your personal life and activities to re-double your efforts to keep people safe and help suppress the community spread of this terrible disease. Wear a mask. Stay home. Do not gather for Thanksgiving beyond your immediate household. There is no room for delay. Now is the time to act. Now is the time to set aside our personal and political preferences for the common good. Now is the time to lead the way.

The Minnesota Department of Health is reporting increasing numbers of new cases daily. Here are some sobering statistics for our state:

- In May, we were averaging 800 new cases a day. Recently we have been seeing more than 7,000.
- It took us 29 weeks to reach 100,000 cases, six weeks to reach 200,000, and will likely take less than three weeks to get to 300,000. We are in a snowball.
- There are cases in every county in Minnesota and we are averaging a 30 percent positivity rate across the state. That means in a group of 10 people, three are likely to have COVID-19. A 30 percent or higher rate of community spread is considered high-risk.
- In just two days, on Monday and Tuesday of this week, nearly 200 persons were admitted to hospitals statewide due to COVID-19. Our hospitals are reaching maximum capacity, and our healthcare shortage is growing due to staff persons being out sick after contracting the virus.



The next six to 12 weeks will be critical, according to Dr. Michael Osterholm, director of the Center for Infectious Disease Research and Policy at the University of Minnesota and one of the nation's leading infectious disease experts.

Group and family gatherings have been the most significant source of the spread of COVID-19 in recent weeks. We have the power to help change the trajectory of the pandemic in Minnesota. Doing no harm, acting for the common good, and protecting the most vulnerable among us is how we love our neighbors. We can give rise to the light in the midst of the darkness of this disease. *(continued on next page)*

So, I am making a difficult ask. Advent and Christmas is a season when we most want to gather, but this year, we need to be a light to others to by continuing to worship at home and online, and limiting our personal activities to what is absolutely essential.

We can do this hard thing. We can do it because we do not rely on our own strength and capacities. We rely on the promise made real in the incarnation: God is with us. The birth of the Christ child we celebrate this season proclaims that. So now we live it.

Thank you for all the ways you are continuing to be creative in ministry and faithful to our call to heal a broken world!
