

### Pastor's Message

Greetings The PORT,

This month is dedicated to Fathers. I have seen many Dad being a role model to their kids, community, and the world. Let's continue to cheer them on.

I came across this from a article, "For the young son, Dad stands for all he wants to be in life 'when he grows up'. He watches with eyes and ears that record how Dad lives, whether it be in the home, on the job, or in their time of recreation as a family. This recording takes place on a daily basis in his life, as one day he will push 'play', and become a Dad himself. For the young daughter, Dad is her knight in shining armor with the responsibility to protect her, yet tender enough to shower her with his unconditional love when she needs to know he's there. Each month a Fleet is assigned a specific task and will rotate amongst the Fleets. This means that twice a year you will have the same task.

#### **Prayer Walkers**

- Pray while walking through your chosen area. Pray a Scripture-based theme. For example, take biblical prayers and recite them or take a photocopy of a Scripture passage with you as you walk.
  - If For the Fleets first Prayer Walk, please coordinate a time with Pastor Henry so that the team can learn the ins and outs of prayer walking.
  - ◊ Fleet Leaders may ask team members to walk specific days and a specific prayer.
  - Prayer walking can be done as a group or individually.

#### Volunteer Visitors

- Bring fellowship to our Church Members who are home-bound or in the hospital. This may include bringing Communion, helping with technology or having a lunch date at their house with fellow members.
  - For the Fleets first Volunteer Visitor month, please coordinate a time with Pastor Henry to meet a fellow church member that is homebound.
  - ♦ Fleet leaders may ask individuals to visit these people weekly.

#### **Relationship Builders**

- Make phone calls during the week to check on the mental, spiritual, and physical wellbeing of our members that may be homebound or haven't been to church in a while.
- Call Visitors/Guests to invite them back to church.
  - I Fleet Leaders will assign team members to call and check on members that are on the

prayer chain.

Note, we are still working out the logistics of how the Fleet Leaders will know we had visitors/guest to get their phone numbers, address, or emails.

#### Welcomers

- Greet and welcome our members and visitors as they come through our doors.
  - Currently with the help of Ginny Karki, she has assigned people from the various fleets. Nancy is reviewing the list and will be notifying the Church office and the team.
  - ♦ This fall we are hopeful that the Fleet Leader can assign individuals for the month.

#### Friends of The PORT

- Send birthday cards to our members utilizing the existing cards, addresses and the list of our members birthdates. Participate in a cardmaking gathering to create unique cards for others.
  - Currently, there is a box of cards that the team can use for sending out cards. Else others can buy or make their own cards.
  - The goal is to have the Fleet Leader assign a person or two to each team member to have them send out a birthday card to our members.
  - ◊ If the Fleet needs help covering the cost of stamps, please notify Nancy Hagerty.

#### Fellowship

- For the selected month, Fleets will provide snacks for the church in the Wesley Room
- Tasks are to fill Keurigs & teapot with water, set up snacks, plates/napkins/silverware (these are provided by the church), clean tables and sweep after Fellowship
  - Fleet leader will assign induvial to either help with snacks or work to set up and clean up. An individual can contribute whatever they are comfortable with: time, money, treats, etc. If a Fleet needs help with covering the cost of the food, please notify Nancy Hagerty.

# Spotlight on Peggy Larson!

Peggy Larson, our fearless Sanctuary Choir Director and Music Director, is retiring after 21 years with The PORT! As we reflect on Peggy's time here, I got feedback and reminiscing from many of the choir members and people who have worked closely with her!

Peggy joined the church 21 years ago after we had a few transitions in the choir and the choir members were regrouping. Many people remember when Peggy auditioned for the position. "She was obviously well qualified and versatile, she had amazing credentials and she had such a pleasant way about her as she directed the choir." She stood out from the several candidates that auditioned and we chose her as our new leader. After Peggy was hired and we started to work under her direction, her true gifts and talents emerged!

Peggy was patient and kind as she dealt with the many levels of skills in the choir. "Peggy's patience with the variety of singers' abilities and personalities is amazing! There were many 'shenanigans' that went on during rehearsal and she would firmly and calmly bring us back to the task at hand." Many said that she has more patience than any other director they've worked with. Peggy is tenacious in a kind and loving way! One person said, "Peggy has always challenged the choir with



some harder than normal anthems. Often times I thought that we could never pull off a particular piece, but somehow it always came together in the end." She challenged us with her calm patience, her quick wit and her never ending confidence that we could figure it out if we broke it down into manageable pieces. Another person said "She has always been able to get us to sing songs that we thought were impossible and I would end up thinking 'wow,' we did that?!" From Ave Maria to Travelin' Shoes, Classic to Gospel, Old favorites from our files to Contemporary, we have performed a wide variety of songs under her leadership. "I will miss Peggy's Jazz and Blues stylized solos – and of course who could forget the cow calling."

Another said, "Peggy's been a strong leader, always reliable, and has always worked hard in getting us to try different things!" Still another said, "Peggy has always been supportive and very patient with everyone in the

choir – even when it's clearly not deserved! This is something that I have always admired." They continued, "She is unapologetically herself, and you see that through the music she



chooses. It is clear that her faith is strong and that she truly celebrates God through music!"

Peggy always brings out the best in everyone, not only in the choir setting, but in everyone who knows her. She is encouraging and positive – she seems to always be in a good mood! Several people indicated that Peggy helped to fuel their love of music – she taught "tons of fun songs" as she helped with the children's choir for many years! "Her passion and love for music is shown in everything she does"! One person indicated "my on-

ly intention was to sing with SonRise and Peggy was persistent in asking me to sing with Sanctuary choir, which allowed me to meet others from the church and grow stronger friendships! I will be forever grateful for that!"


I think the biggest thing about Peggy is that she hasn't just been our Choir Director or Music Director, she has become a dear friend! She has participated in other areas of the church life and we regard
