Pastor's Message

Greetings Members and Friends of The PORT,

Summer came too fast. It seems some of us are having a blast at cabins, camping, and time away. While others are busy. Whatever the situation please find time to study, obey, and teach scriptures. There are countless resources out there. You can start with Genesis or Matthew. I am reading Acts.

To make my point, I came across Ezra 7:10. In this verse Ezra sets his heart to study the Law of the Lord, and to do it and to teach his statutes and rules in Israel.

He set his heart. Studying God's Word is not something which happens automatically. My guess is lately you might have asked someone "how are you doing?" to hear them reply, "I am very busy." In fact, almost every person says they are very busy. The world is full of stuff to do. Some of these things are worth doing. But the world is also full of distractions, vying for our attention. It is easy for us to be diverted from serious Bible study. Many people spend more time (or we could say waste more time) on passing pleasures than they do on the Bible. How much time do we spend on television and movies compared to studying Scripture? How much time do we spend surfing the internet and social media compared to studying Scripture? How much time do we spend on our hobbies compared to studying Scripture?

If we want to make spiritual progress like Ezra, we must set our hearts on learning God's Word. It is first a desire, a commitment. Then this desire will lead us to action.

We need to study. The first step in following God is knowledge. A person must know God. A person must have knowledge of the truth. We find that in the Bible. The Bible is an amazing thing. The infinite, eternal, Creator of the universe is completely different than us. He exists outside of our realm of comprehension. And yet, He has chosen to make Himself known to us. He has chosen to reveal His nature, His plans, and His purposes to us. That is an amazing privilege.

Scripture is God's inspired Word, breathed out by Him. It is a priceless treasure. And it is worth diligently studying. Studying God's Word is one way you can grasp God's Word, standing firm on the truth in the midst of the tidal forces of cultural change and relativity. Without a firm understanding of the Bible, you will be like a person who builds his house on the sand.


In addition, Ezra set his heart to study God's word and to do it. Friends, to do it means to obey it. Knowledge by itself does not help anyone. Ezra set his heart to study God's Word and to do it. Without action, the knowledge is worthless. James calls out people who are "hearers" of the Word, but not "doers," comparing them to people who look at a mirror and forget what they look like (James 1:19-25). We can do it as we set our heart to study God's Word.

Furthermore, to teach it. Friends, Ezra 7:10 gives us a wonderful model. It wasn't enough for Ezra himself to study and obey God's word. His vision was then to teach others to do the same. That is spiritual reproduction. That is multiplication.

Let's set our heart to study God's Word by obeying it and teaching it. Be Blessed and know that God loves you and there's absolutely nothing you can do about it.



Our Sunday School year runs from September through May each year. We hope all of our teachers are enjoying some well-deserved time off this summer! Thank you, teachers, for all you do!






Trustees News

Our Trustees have been very busy this spring, as always, maintaining our church building and property. **Thank you** to our dedicated team: Wayne Andersen, Don Anderson, Clint Andrus, Harvey Erstad, Steve Knopp, Paul Richardson, Scott Swenson, and Tom Wellman. **We are very grateful for all that you do for The PORT!**

Here are some of the many jobs that these faithful volunteers have been doing:

- Kitchen garbage disposal repairs. The Trustees removed the unit to make the necessary repairs, put in new plumbing for the unit, repaired a broken switch and reinstalled everything to working condition. Their hard work and volunteer time saved the church around \$2,000.00.
- Replaced the front office phone system. Don Anderson and Pam Rose interviewed two phone vendors to find a badly needed replacement for the archaic phone system that was failing. Installation was completed on June 14th.
- Roof leak repairs in Sanctuary and South entryway. They cleaned out the space over the south entry door and found the cutter was plugged which caused water to leak through that ceiling. The Sanctuary roof has leaked from the heavy rainfalls we've seen this spring so that requires regular attention to address the wet carpet and pew cushions to dry them as quickly as possible.
- Lawn maintenance, weed control, removing tree roots. The church has a commercial service that maintains our lawns, but the Trustees have to mow the courtyard and keep up with the weeds and the tree roots that sprout where they're not wanted.
- A special thanks to Julie and Jake Rasmussen for their hard work on a very hot day as they refreshed the landscaping in the planted areas around the bicycle racks on the island between the church and the parking lot. It looks so much nicer. Thank you Julie and Jake!
