

Pastor's Message Rev. Carol Zaagsma

I need not even say how the year 2020 brought a number of personal and global challenges that required creativity and resolve. In some ways this was invigorating, while in other ways it was completely disorienting and perhaps even defeating. It's times like this when I'm particularly grateful for a fresh start; and the arrival of a new year provides a natural opportunity for this.

And yet the attempt at a fresh start won't happen magically with the turning of a page on the calendar - it will require some intentional effort. Peg Streep wrote an article with a helpful list of steps to take toward a fresh start:

- Manage your regrets. Write them down. Look at them. Evaluate whether they come from action or inaction. And offer some measure of forgiveness for yourself when trying to put them into perspective.
- 2) Deal with your rumination. Take steps to get off your carousel of repetitive thoughts. Make an effort to talk with others about your worries, or even set a "worry time" where you devote yourself to worrying during that period alone; but then set them aside when the time allotted is up.
- 3) Think about new goals in abstract terms. Move away from the specifics of a situation or goal to a more nuanced or deeper understanding of your wants and needs. Instead of a goal to lose weight, make a goal to live a healthier lifestyle then you can make choices from there rather than riding a roller coaster with each pound gained or lost.
- 4) Adopt the right mindset. A deliberative mindset helps you weigh your choices and strategies while an implemental mindset helps you focus on your actions. Be flexible enough to shift between the two and adjust to how God's Spirit is working.

5) Motivate yourself. Be creative about this. Also remember that you are a child of God and worthy of fresh starts in life. God is a God of fresh starts!

Of course, there are many different aspects of life one might want a fresh start at - a relationship, a job or career, a hobby or leisure activity, healthy living, spirituality, or any number of other areas of life.

As far as your spiritual life goes, we've provided two ready-made fresh start opportunities as the new year arrives. If you want to make a commitment to read the Bible through in one year, we have a schedule available to help you accomplish this. Call the church office for a copy of you'd like one (more info on the next page of this newsletter). I also included a "Star Word" for each person in your household in this year's March to the Manger/ Christmas letter. Your Star Word was chosen completely at random from over 200 different words and placed in your envelope; so you are the only one from The PORT to receive your word this year. Embark on 2021 with an open spirit to what God may be growing in you relative to the unique word you received.

John Wesley is known for having said, "The best of all is, God is with us!" No matter what your fresh start looks like this year, or how rotten the outgoing year was

for you, please know that you are loved and cared for by me and others at The PORT... and even more importantly: "The best of all is, God is with us!" Let's walk into 2021 with this truth firmly in our hearts.

Mission Outreach

January Mission Outreach Project -Valley View Elementary School Teacher & Staff Appreciation

We have an opportunity in January to say "thank you" to the teachers and staff of Valley View Elementary School as a way to offer encouragement and a blessing in what is a rather challenging year.



The Mission Outreach Team is coordinating two specific ways to say "thank you" on behalf of The PORT. First, we're planning to supply individually wrapped snacks for the staff break room on their first day back to in-person learning on January 19. Having access to a salty, sweet or even healthy snack that day for teachers and staff members during their prep time or lunch break will undoubtedly be a great day brightener. It's like we're saying, "We know you're here and we appreciate you."

Secondly, provided we have enough support and participation for this project, we'd like to say a more personal "thank you" to each teacher and staff member with a card and a small gift card (enough to buy a special coffee drink on the way to work... probably \$5 each). We know this is a big goal with 90 teachers and staff at Valley View Elementary, but we also know that our members and friends have a big heart for this school that is just blocks away from The PORT.

Simpson Shelter Donation Drive Recap

December's Mission Outreach Project was to collect new hats, gloves, mittens, scarves and socks for guests of Simpson Shelter. Your response was tremendous to round out a year of giving from The PORT!



We collected 73 pairs of warm socks, 31 hats or other headgear items, 7 children's mittens, and 27 pairs of gloves. These items will surely be of great help this winter to those who are experiencing homelessness, while also serving as a sign of God's grace and love.

Cornerstone Dinner Meal Recap

In July, the Mission Outreach Team put out a call to provide approximately 25 meals to Cornerstone Shelter for August. Because of the coronavirus, Cornerstone could not allow groups in to serve meals, but they were asking help in having boxed meals delivered to them. We asked you to sponsor a meal at \$14 each to cover the food, tax and delivery fee.

Your response was so great that we have been able to provide not only a meal in August, but also September, October, November, AND December! We have had meals from Jimmy John's, Davanni's, and Pot Belly's delivered to them. The Mission Outreach Team would like to thank all who helped to make this possible. Cornerstone Shelter is very appreciative of this.





Greetings PORT Family! The 2020 Online Bazaar was a virtual Success!

Under the circumstances of a very challenging year, with a global pandemic in our midst, we formed a Bazaar Sub Committee to see how we could proceed with our Bazaar. For the past 46 years, so many people in our community look forward to attending the PAUMC Bazaar on the 2nd weekend of November. They arrive looking for the "staples" of our sale - the traditional personalized ornaments, kitchen towels & needlework, holiday decorations, pottery, woodworking and too many more to name. The Bazaar has a reputation for always providing quality handmade and creative items, and this year was no exception.



Over the years our specialty items have changed - from hundreds of loaves of bread from the Robinson's Bakery to the Silent Auction that the Soucy's have spearheaded.

Through the years we've forged ahead with providing a well organized, festive Bazaar who's quality remains top notch!

The challenges of 2020 will be a year that most of us will not soon forget. We needed to plan a Bazaar which included distancing, sanitation, masks and gloves, limited number of people in the building, and no homemade edibles!

The committee had a plan in place, but then the Governor's directive came down,

and it didn't look like we could do an "in person" Bazaar at all.

We quickly shifted gears, and started searching for an online alternative. We found an option, started taking pictures of every item, assigning item numbers and categorizing items into groups. It was a time consuming endeavor, but we were excited to see it through! We developed our "system" for curbside pickup, set up a PORT Bazaar website, phone number and email address, and with a few awesome yard signs that Scott Rice donated, we opened for business.

We are excited to say our online Bazaar was greatly received, positively reviewed and it brought a tiny bit of normalcy to our patrons that shopped. To date, we have made approximately \$4,000 (a fraction of our normal Bazaar proceeds, but all things considered, pretty great)! We are pleased with how it all turned out.

We missed the bakery, lefse, candy and holiday food items that have been a staple at our Bazaar for years, but under the circumstances the customers understood why, and they were just happy we were having our sale. For many of the faithful followers of our bazaar - this year's online version truly became living proof of The PORT - a safe harbor along life's journey.

We want to thank everyone who contributed in whatever way they were able. Although we missed being surrounded by our PORT family, we had immense help and support from many people in our congregation (who understandably were not able to be working at the church), but shopped, provided items to sell, called to provide moral support and those who left us sweet notes of appreciation on the website.

Now we hope you'll join us in anticipating and looking forward to our traditional Holiday Bazaar returning in 2021.
