Pastor's Message Rev. Carol Zaagsma

In a mailing last December to all members and friends of The PORT, the idea of Star Words was introduced, along with a randomly picked Star Word written on a yellow poster board star for each member of your family.

While I was aware of all the various words selected to become Star Words, the process of distributing them truly was random. Your Star Word was a gift to you, with encouragement to ponder what significance it might have in your life, or to consider how God might be speaking to you in the coming year through *your* word.

A Star Word was picked at random for me, too. I'll be honest – knowing the whole list of words, I was hoping beyond hope to receive the word REST in my mailing.

My routine has been so very different with pandemic responsibilities at church. What used to be a demanding schedule became much more onerous with navigating the technical challenges of shifting from in-person to online worship (seriously, I didn't even know how to record video on my camera) leading staff and leaders in the congregation to reimagine their ministry areas to engage folks virtually, many additional videoconference meetings, and not only preparing worship (designing liturgy, writing sermon, etc.) but in pandemic times, extending that worship-prep process by up to 3 hours of recording time and 10-12 more hours per week editing and video uploading time. To say that I wanted, perhaps even needed, the Star Word REST is an understatement.

Instead, I got the word REVIVE. Revive means to return to consciousness or life – to become active or flourishing again. It sounds like really hard word. Like I so often do, the first thing that came to mind is this word in the context of this congregation. Is that what my Star Word is about? I'm exhausted. Yet is God urging me to revive all of us as individuals as well as our entire congregational structure and culture and systems?

After <u>much</u> prayer (like, this really weighed heavy on my heart, so I prayed <u>a lot</u>), it became clear to me that it's not my job alone to revive us. We've all got work to put in as far as that goes, and to lean on the power of the Holy Spirit, too. Furthermore, we each have our own Star Word to consider how God is speaking through our word, so perhaps it's fitting that I take on my Star Word in a more personal manner, while trusting you all are doing the same. Out of that, we all might be revived!

Again, through much prayer, I realized that God is encouraging me to take on this word REVIVE in relation to the personal joys I had set aside amid the rigorous demands of pastoring in a pandemic – joys such as trumpet playing, spontaneous mid-day play with Bailey, cooking/baking (I had asked for and received a casserole cookbook for Christmas, so have enjoyed trying many new recipes from it since the first of the year), and developing the routine where I end every day with a phone call to my mom to see how her day went. I also signed up to take the remaining six courses required for my MBA in an effort to REVIVE my career goals. And you know what? I'm beginning to feel revived.

This is just my journey so far this year with my Star Word. The year is young, so I imagine my relationship to my Star Word will continue to change and shift and grow as the year progresses. Perhaps more importantly is the question about how you've been getting along with your Star Word so far this year? I'd be curious to hear from you, so please call or send me a


March Mission Outreach Project — VEAP Food Shelf

All Church Conference Accepts The PORT's 2021 Budget

At the 2020 All Church Conference held on January 28, the PAUMC 2021 Budget was accepted by the Church Council. The Budget shows a projected shortfall of \$12,208 for the year. This looks concerning; but we feel that with keeping expenses in check and hoping for stronger than projected Easter and Advent offerings, we will come out fine at the end of 2021.

Last year, we overcame a forecasted \$15,289 deficit because of the generosity of members and friends of Portland Avenue United Methodist Church.

PAUMC receives \$34,000 from the other churches and the dance studio that use our building, which enables us to come relatively close to a balanced budget. We have a good relationship with these people, and we are grateful for having that income in helping us run our facility. ~ Dave Smith, Treasurer

Insurance Change and Roof Repairs

The Trustees has been busy with the following activates for the church:

- Researched and changed insurance carriers which saves the church approximately \$1,900 yearly while maintaining the same coverages.
- Oversaw significant roof repairs, tree removal, and maintained tree trimming on the property
- Repaired the south boiler and the church's sign in ۲ front.
