Pastor's Message

Greetings The PORT,

Mark 16:1-6 (NKJV) ¹ Now when the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, that they might come and anoint Him. 2 Very early in the morning, on the first day of the week, they came to the tomb when the sun had risen. 3 And they said among themselves, "Who will roll away the stone from the door of the tomb for us?" 4 But when they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled away–for it was very large. 5 And entering the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a long white robe sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. 6 But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid Him."

As we can see, while they were on the way to the tomb, which they clearly thought would contain the dead body of the Lord, they had their mind on the impossibility that would confront them soon. "Who will roll away the stone from the door of the tomb?" Don't Allow Impossibilities to Stop You!

While they thought of the impossible task ahead, they knew their simple mission must continue. There were no thoughts of the promises that had been previously made by the Lord of His resurrection. What would be the chances of something like that happening anyway? Too often, when we are going through this life we are confronted with situations that might seem impossible. Let me remind you today that we serve a risen, miracleworking Savior!

While at times we may think something is impossible, I believe God wants us to have faith in this wonderful God who makes all things possible!

Matthew 19:26 (NKJV) ²⁶ But Jesus looked at them and said to them, "With men, this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."



The PORT Fleets: Refuel at The PORT then go out into the world as Jesus' hands and feet to serve others

We have been talking about the "groups" in church for several weeks now, and there seems to be some confusion. So let me try and clear some things up.

Background:

Pastor Henry had an awesome idea to split the congregation up into groups. We're calling them The PORT Fleets 1-6. One of the first questions that came up is what is the purpose of the groups or Fleets?

Purpose:

- Get to know people in the church outside of the activities that you're currently participating in
- Get to know what's going on in the church, what it takes to run the church
- Get more people involved in the workings of the church
- Start to expand our work as the Hands and Feet of Jesus Christ in the community

What if I don't have a group?

Many people have started to participate in groups/ Fleets. If you do not have a group or Fleet, we have assigned you to one! Check out the bulletin board in the narthex for updates on who is in each Fleet.

What's happening with my group?

We are identifying a leader in each Fleet – this position is meant to be someone who will help wrangle the Fleet and act as a central point for communication, questions, and coordination of monthly activities. Each Fleet is assigned monthly tasks! See the schedule on the bulletin board for what your Fleet is assigned to do!

What do I need to do?

PARTICIPATE! That's all you need to do! First: figure out what group you're in! Next: find out who your Fleet leader is and check in with them!

Then: participate! Each Fleet has monthly tasks and activities so participate in as much as you can! You will meet new people and expand your faith and your commitment to The PORT and to your spiritual journey and growth!

Eventually, we will be using these Fleets to expand our outreach into the community! That sounds scary to some of us, but we will take it slow and find things for each of us that are aligned with our comfort level, talents, and gifts!

So jump in!

Join us and see where it takes you individually and where it takes us as a spiritual community! We need you! Each of you have gifts and talents that we need here at The PORT!
