Pastor's Message

Greetings,

As we enter the month of June, I pray that the month will work in your favor, in the name of Jesus Christ. This month, I want to encourage us to celebrate graduates and recognize Fathers.

Graduates, you have worked hard to achieve this milestone in your life, and we, your church family, want to help you celebrate this important milestone in your life. The Bible says in Romans 12:15a to "rejoice with those who rejoice," and we hope you don't mind if we do just that! On behalf of the leadership and congregation here at The PORT, we want to take this time to congratulate you and send prayers your way for God's continuous blessings. Thank you for a job well done.

This month as we also recognize Fathers. I offer these words of tribute from the perspective of the role of our Godly Father. For the young son, Dad stands for all he wants to be in life "when he grows up." He watches with eyes and ears that record how Dad lives, whether it be in the home, on the job, or in their time of recreation as a family. This recording takes place on a daily basis in his life, as one day he will push the "play" button and become a Dad himself. For the young daughter, Dad is her knight in shining armor with the responsibility to protect her, yet tender enough to shower her with his unconditional love when she needs to know he's there. Music & Memory—Donate Your Old CDs to Walker Methodist Auxiliary

One of the programs of the Walker Methodist Auxiliary is "Music & Memory." This program consists of storing thousands of songs on iTunes via a laptop with an external hard drive. Board Member Bob Bayers cre-



ates individualized play lists, based on residents' preferences. He then loads the lists on iPods/MP3 players so the residents, families, and staff are able to listen to hours of the residents' favorite music. The Music & Memory program continues to improve and benefit the lives of people with dementia/Alzheimer's, their families, and the Walker staff.

Since this program's inception more than eight years ago, over 500 iPods/MP3 players have been created, many of which have been returned to inventory by residents who have either been discharged or have expired. There are currently 290 iPods/MP3 players being used by Walker residents.

Donated CDs have continually been added to the program's library, which now includes over 30,000 song titles. We are continually looking for additional CDs to add to the library! All types of music are needed, including Big Band, Country, Rock, Classic, Christmas, and any other CDs you have that you don't listen to anymore. Also, if you happen to have any used iPods, MP3 players, or old iPhones, we can use those too.

If you'd like to donate old CDs or equipment mentioned above, please box or bag it and label it "WMHC Music & Memory." Bring it to church and either leave behind the Welcomer's Desk or drop off in the office during office hours: T, W, Th 9:00 am - 1:00 pm.
