# Pastor's Message

Each year around the Thanksgiving season, I follow some friends on social media repeating a tradition to share each day, over 30 days, something they're thankful for. It's a wonderful practice! One of the things I love about seeing all my friends posting what they're thankful for is that I know some of these people are facing hard things. So, behind the smiles and thanks are also tears and heartache.

The Bible has a lot to say about "giving thanks." A common phrase in the book of Psalms is "enter His gates with thanksgiving" (Psalm 100:4)

gates with thanksgiving." (Psalm 100:4). No matter our season of life, there can always be a reason to enter God's gates and give thanks. How? I think Psalm 100:4 tells us exactly why we are always welcome to enter with praise.

Can't you imagine, if all is stripped away, how do we enter God's house with thanksgiving? What if our hands are empty? I believe we can give thanks because of who God is, not just what God has done. Thanksgiving is not only about what God does for us, but all God is for us. Friends, there are lots of things God does for us for which we can give thanks. So much! We have God's salvation for our sins. He listens to our prayers and provides for our needs. We can give God thanks for all these things, but I believe there is more. As I reflect on this year, I want to remember all God is instead of thinking about what He's done. Yes, I am thankful for all God has given me and done for me, but I want to be thankful for just simply who God is! I hope you do as well.

We are being made into disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. We are looking to live a life of service and joy. We are being invited to consider our common humanity, our shared experience of living in a world that has heartache and struggle, but also profound joy and satisfaction that is deep and true and binding heart to heart. And it all grows out of an awareness of the interconnectedness of life, which opens us up to living in thanksgiving. Will you join me?

For the entire month of November, let's read verses in the Bible that remind us of God's character and spend some time rejoicing in our God who is beyond compare. There is truly no one like our God and we can give thanks for this! His characteristics give us hope and joy.

Suggested readings: Psalm 100, Psalm 28:6, Psalm 40:11, Psalm 116:1, Psalm 23, and John 10:11,14,16.

# Holiday Bazaar & Attic Treasures

#### Bazaar Week: November 6 - 11

Our 49th Annual Holiday Bazaar is on the way! This is the single largest event our church sponsors and everything that is donated comes from our Port members! Our sale has an excellent reputation and folks really do plan for it as part of their holiday preparations.

As with every important task at The Port, we are looking for everyone's support. The Bazaar will be held on Friday, Nov. 10 from 9 to 6 and Saturday, Nov. 11 from 9 to 3. We have many areas to staff so please consider volunteering for a couple of hours, or longer if you can, throughout the week.

#### How can you help right now?

- -Complete any craft items you're donating and bring them to church by November 5.
- -Donate a gift basket for the silent auction (or the funds for one and we'll shop for you) by November 5. Include an inventory of what's included and the cost for the items.
- -Take fliers to distribute to family and friends or to post in windows or on bulletin boards of places you frequent such as coffee shops, hair and nail salons, libraries, bakeries, etc.
- -Make something for the bake sale. We need sweet breads, cookies, bars, pies, snack mixes, fudge, or holiday treats to sell on Friday and Saturday. We will provide trays you can use to pack your goods and instructions to help with labeling and packaging. Our bakery ladies will do the pricing so you don't have to worry about that.
- **-Donate gently used fall and holiday items** for the Attic Treasures which is sponsored by the Youth and Family Ministries.
- -Use your social media platforms to get the word out and invite your friends and neighbors.

The schedule for "Bazaar Week" is as follows:

Monday and Tuesday Nov. 6 & 7, 6:30pm - Pricing of sale items. Can you help tag items? We will need all personal craft donations by this time. We will NOT be able to accept donations later as we will not have time to price them.

Wednesday, Nov. 8, 11am – Gather tables and set up the room layout. We need strong backs to carry tables and display stands up from the basement and from around the building. At 1pm we will cover the tables with cloths. At 5pm we'll bring merchandize into the room and start setting up the displays.

Thursday, Nov. 9, 10am to 6pm – Display merchandise, decorate room. Attic Treasures will need help pricing and displaying their merchandise in the Wesley Room. **Bake Sale** goods can be dropped off Thursday after 10am and we will need more goods on Friday to stock our tables for Saturday.

Friday, Nov. 11, 9am to 6pm, and Saturday, Nov. 12, 9am to 3pm we are open for business and we need YOU! Please sign up to work as many hours as you can. You'll be standing or sitting behind the tables listing the items our guests are buying on a tablet for them to pay at the central cashier. You will not need to handle money, just offer a smile and a warm "hello". This is a great way to meet our neighbors and to show them the warm hospitality of The Port. It's a very fun time!

**Saturday at 3pm** we'll clean the room and haul the tables back to storage. Strong backs and legs will be needed again. With lots of help we should be done by 5pm.

Thank you all in advance for your support of this longstanding labor of love. We sincerely hope you will come often this week to help us get ready and to join in the fun! This is a great way for high school students to get volunteer hours too.

Please pray for the success of our Holiday Bazaar and for the strength and health of our workers and guests. We hope to see you all there! If none of this is possible for you, then come down and visit, eat and shop. You won't be sorry!


