



IMPORTANT HOLIDAY BAZAAR NEWS:

Did you know that our church is famous? We are known throughout the Minnesota Methodist Conference and our local community as the church with the "great Holiday Bazaar"! This November 8th & 9th will mark the 50th anniversary of this big event. We should be very proud of this longstanding heritage and labor of love! 50 years!! Not many things last that long in this world anymore, particularly in retail sales! Any and all items sold at our bazaar are handmade by our church members and we staff it ourselves too. So you can see how this requires a full group effort.

Friends, as our Wesleyan Heritage teaches us, we ask EVERY one of YOU to help us as much as you can, as often as you can, in as many ways as you can, and for as long as you can. And this particular ask is not a long commitment! We have less than 12 weeks to go, so here are some ways you can jump in to help:

- ~ Attend either the Thursday morning or Tuesday evening workshop groups to help make goods in assembly line fashion. You don't need to be "crafty". We can guide you! You also can come when you can, no weekly commitment required.
- ~ If you are "crafty", consider making and donating some items for our sale. Wood items, like accent signs or shelves, plant stands or foot stools, or toys and small useful items are always in demand.
- ~ If you can sew, knit or crochet, we can use blankets, winter gloves, hats, scarves, kitchen towels, baby items, dog bandanas and blankets, etc.
- ~ Can you paint, make jewelry or pottery, do photography or floral arrangements? All of those items would make great home accessory gifts. And for our bakers, please plan now for what you can contribute to our bake sale!
- ~ You could put together a themed gift basket of new, non-perishable items that we can put out in our silent auction. We will provide the basket and make the display, we just need the goods.

One more big ask – please set aside some extra time the week of the bazaar to help us carry out this important event, including working extra shifts on Friday and Saturday.
